Announcement of Positions

Day Camp 2010

Camp Background

Since 1959, the First Chinese Baptist Church of San Francisco has been committed to providing quality summer programs for the community. Located in the heart of Chinatown, the church serves both English and Chinese-speaking persons from the surrounding neighborhoods and the larger Bay Area. Our focus for this year is to introduce our Savior Jesus Christ, through the telling of His parables, to the Chinatown youth through Bible lessons, games, activities, not to mention fun and exciting fieldtrips--and of course through witnessing. **This year, Camp will run for 6 weeks, from Monday June 14th to Friday July 23rd, 2010.**

Job Description- Each year, the structure of Day Camp changes slightly depending upon the working style of the Director and upon the personnel available. Training will be provided so that all applicants will be confident and equipped to do God's work.

We are committed to working with all applicants and believe there is a place for all people interested in serving. However, we do want all applicants to be placed in a position where they can best use their gifts.

Counselor Criteria

Criteria for the selection process of positions include:

1. Application and recommendations
2. Previous experience working with children
3. Active participation within a Christian church or school fellowship
4. Interview with the Day Camp committee- (time to be announced)
5. Familiarity with First Chinese Baptist Church
6. Availability to work full time for all the weeks of the program

Selection of positions will be decided by the Day Camp director(s) based upon the recommendation of the FCBC Day Camp Committee (which includes members of the Children's Committee, Church Staff, and previous Day Camp Directors.)

Description of Positions

A **Senior Counselor** will be expected to:

1. Coordinate the work of the Jr. Counselor(s) appointed to his/her group.
2. Direct and provide in service training for the C.I.T.('s) assigned to his/her group.
3. Organize and delegate responsibilities for all activities. Lead the staff persons under his/her direction.
4. Work in cooperation and under the direction of a peer in the position of Day Camp Director.
5. In addition, the Senior Counselor should be capable of carrying out all the responsibilities of the Jr. Counselor.
6. Attend all staff meetings, training times, and to lead/participate in daily devotions.
7. Facilitate and oversee the progress of the group

A **Junior Counselor** will be expected to:

1. Supervise a group of six to eight children.
2. Teach a Bible-based curriculum.
3. Plan outdoor activities that will enhance the spiritual, mental, and physical growth of children in appropriate ways.
4. Organize crafts, music, drama, and/or other indoor activities.
5. Work in cooperation with both the staff directing him/her and the staff he/she is directing to provide joint activities for children.
6. Manage facilities involved with the group.
7. Attend all staff meeting, training times, and to participate in daily devotions.

A Counselor in Training (C.I.T.)- C.I.T.s will be trained in the skills expected of a Junior and ultimately a Senior Counselor. Job responsibilities will vary from individual to individual. Each C.I.T. must attend all staff meetings, training times, and participate in daily devotions.

Applicants will be expected to be available for all the weeks of Camp. Priority in making staff assignments will be given to those who make themselves available to attend all training meetings and work full time in the VCS/Day Camp program. If you are unable to attend full time, please consider these opportunities:

Volunteers- Although all counselors are considered to be volunteers, this specified position is for those who want to help out with day camp but are unable to attend full time due to summer school or vacation. We strongly recommend those who are interested in being part of our staff but will not be able to serve full time for more than 3 weeks to consider this position.

Intern - The express purpose of this position is to give students an opportunity to serve at Day Camp for one week because they live too far away to commit to the full term. This program has a limited amount of openings and applicants must complete the interview process and be available for all training sessions. The expectations of an intern will vary depending upon the age and experience of the applicant but will be similar to CIT/Junior counselor expectations.

After Hours Program- This program is designed to meet this growing need for extended day care as an extension of the regular VCS Day Camp Program. Like the traditional program, the Day Camp After Hours Program (AHP) will run for the same schedule as Day Camp. Each AHP day, however, will only last for two hours: from 3:30, at regular dismissal time, through 5:30, when program

participants will be picked up. This time will largely be supervised playtime, and will include one snack time.

Job Description for After Hours Program Counselors:

The structure of this program will be a work in progress, and may change slightly as the weeks progress to meet unforeseen needs. However, some basic requirements must be met by AHP staff members:

1. AHP staff members must have had previous experience as a VCS Day Camp counselor, or a similar experience in another program.
2. AHP staff members must be available for the entirety of the program, beginning at 3:15, to receive participants at day camp closing.
3. AHP staff members must be recommended by someone recognized and approved by the CE Board at FCBC.
4. AHP staff members must have a working knowledge of first aid and CPR, as emergency situations may arise.

Any other qualities that will contribute to a happy, healthy environment at FCBC are welcome, but the above mentioned are the minimum requirements.

Compensation for all positions (except Volunteers):

Every year, the amount of income brought in through Day Camp varies with the number of campers that are enrolled. Because the hiring of the staff must take place before the budget is finalized, the exact dollar stipend cannot be determined until after Camp begins.

Counselors will be given the option of applying any day camp compensation directly to the Youth Camp registration fee. This amount is totally refundable if the counselor is unable to attend. Please check the appropriate box on the application form.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE:

1. Return the attached application to First Chinese Baptist Church, attention: Chris Otani or to Day Camp directors Nate Lee or Donald Ma.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY SUNDAY, March 28th!

Interviews will be held on **April 4th and April 11th** in the afternoon. You will receive a phone call or email regarding the exact time and place.

2. A recommendation letter is required in conjunction with the application.

The Confidential Recommendation application should be given to an adult or youth leader who can assess your capabilities in relation to the position for which you are applying. Be sure to allow the person recommending you ample time to return the form by the deadline date. The person recommending you should return their form separately.
